1. Authority -- The decisions of the CAS/CSAC Esports Committee and/or Meet Directors relative to the operation of the competition shall be final.
2. Awards – In each class a plaque will be awarded to each of the champions and a 1st runner-up team.
3. Date of Competition / Site / Starting Times
 - a. Date: State Championship – May 3, 2024
 - b. Site: Quinnipiac University, 305 Sherman Ave, Hamden, CT 06518 (Rocky Top Student Center)
 - c. State Championship Schedule:
 - 8amET- Students arrive

 - 9am ET —Rocket League Final

 - 10am ET —Super Smash Final

 - 12 pm ET — Mario Kart Final
 - *Awards will be handed out at the conclusion of each title's competition
 - d. The CAS/CSAC Esports Committee will determine the starting time for each game competing and a follow-up email will be sent to each school.
4. Only member schools of CAS-CIAC may enter these championships.
5. Chereese Odukwe, is the Tournament Official Coordinator
6. All competitors must be grade 9, 10, 11 or 12.
7. Esports coaches are expected to maintain discipline among the competitors and make certain that good sportsmanship prevails in both winning and defeat. Schools will be held liable for actions of their competitors which may include but is not limited to property damage or assault.

8. Competitors will not be permitted to compete without the presence of their coach/advisor, or having in writing from the Principal of the school a statement designating an adult replacement.
